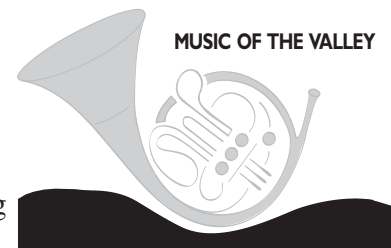

All concerts will be performed in the Bankhead Theater of the Livermore Valley Performing Arts Center. This 500-seat theater, located at 2400 First Street in downtown Livermore, was opened in October 2007. Prelude talks are presented from 7 to 7:30 p.m., and the Symphony concerts begin at 8 p.m. (Doors open at 6:45 p.m.)

Membership in the Symphony Association

Membership in the Symphony Association is a benefit accorded to volunteer musicians in the orchestra and to those who donate \$50 or more. Members vote for directors and receive priority seating. (Donors of \$50 or more are entitled to two memberships.)

Reserved Seating

New season-ticket subscription orders will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis with priority given to donors.
